MORNING DROP-OFFS

I've noticed an increasing number of students being dropped off at school before 8:30am each morning. While we understand the challenges parents face with work commitments, I'd like to remind everyone that supervision in the schoolyard doesn't commence until 8:45am. For the safety of our students, we kindly request that they are not on school grounds before 8:30 am. Some students are arriving even before our teaching staff, raising concerns about their safety. We offer before-school care from 7 am each morning to accommodate early drop-offs, ensuring that student safety remains our top priority. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND WORKS

Exciting news! Our inclusive playground construction will commence at the beginning of Week 5. While this will temporarily disrupt access to our Junior Playground and some play spaces, rest assured that we have plans in place to accommodate this. During the construction period, the side bus gate access will remain open. However, please note that you will need to turn left and walk along the front of the Junior Building to access the school. We'll keep you updated on the progress of the works as they unfold. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of the term, enhancing our school environment for all students. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this time of improvement.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

As the weather cools down, a quick reminder to ensure that students are coming to school in the correct school uniform. We understand that growth spurts happen, so if you're in need of uniform items, we have second-hand options available at the office. Also, please remember to label jumpers so they can be easily returned if misplaced.

ABSENCES

SCHOOL HOURS

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 7:00am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so, but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.
