

SCIENCE WEEK

We are celebrating all things science this Thursday, the 15th of August, for National Science Week. The 2024 school theme is species survival — more than just sustainability. Students will spend the morning rotating through a series of amazing hands-on science activities.

NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING

On Thursday the 15th, we will also recognise The National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence. Bullying No Way is Australia's key bullying prevention initiative and connects schools and communities to find workable solutions to prevent bullying.

Purple is the new hero colour representing Bullying No Way and we are asking all of our students to come dressed in purple to recognise this event.

The theme for 2024 is 'Everyone belongs'. When we all feel like we belong, bullying struggles to find a place. It's about embracing who we are, respecting everyone's differences and standing up together against unkindness.

Belonging means we all have a role in preventing bullying. We're encouraged to speak up and create a safe place where everyone feels supported and respected, and our voices are heard and valued.

BIKE EDUCATION

During Week 6 (19th to the 23rd of August), our students in Years 1-6 will participate in our Bike Education Program, which focuses on teaching bike safety on our roads. This program is crucial for our students, as it equips them with the knowledge and skills to ride their bikes safely and responsibly, both in the neighbourhood and on their way to school. Students are required to bring their bikes to school for the week. They can take them home each day or leave them in our BER building. YEAR 5/6 MELBOURNE EXCURSION

Our Year 5/6 students recently attended an excursion to Melbourne, visiting Parliament House and the Shrine of Remembrance. Students were highly engaged in the simulated Parliament in Action session, eagerly participating and demonstrating a keen interest in the legislative process. They represented the school beautifully, and I was very proud of their behaviour and enthusiasm throughout the day.

PARENT OPINION SURVEY

Our school is conducting the annual Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey and is seeking your feedback. PARKING REMINDER

A quick reminder to all parents about adhering to parking restrictions and requirements along Chisholm Street. ABSENCES

SCHOOL HOURS

Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so, but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.
