Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back to the 2024 school year! I hope this newsletter finds you well-rested and ready for the exciting year that lies ahead. It is with great enthusiasm that I extend a warm welcome to both returning families and those joining our school community for the first time.

We are delighted to welcome Mr Dave Sexton to our school community. Mr S joins us as a new Grade 3/4 teacher. Please join me in extending a warm welcome to Dave. We are confident that his skills and passion for education will enhance the learning experience for our students.

We have had a fantastic start to the year with all our students getting back into the swing of things quickly and a very calm vibe around the school. The focus at the beginning of every school year is on establishing strong routines. Our newsletter will be published fortnightly on a Friday this year and will be posted via Seesaw. I encourage you to read our newsletters as they are an important communication tool between the school and home. If you are yet to be signed up to Seesaw, please see your classroom teacher.

Our Foundation students got off to a wonderful start to their primary schooling - no doubt thanks to the thorough preparation put in by their parents over the holidays. This is a truly exciting time for these students, as well as their families. The Foundation students will have Wednesdays off for the first 6 weeks as they acclimatise to school life, but on those days, their teacher will invite the children back to complete their mandatory Literacy and Numeracy testing. We are seeking volunteers to support the running of our breakfast club in the mornings. If you are able to spare some time between 8:30am and 9:00am, please let us know at the office. Breakfast Club operates on Wednesday and Friday mornings.

Uniform Reminders

A friendly reminder to ensure that students are in full school uniform each day. Uniforms contribute to a sense of belonging and pride in our school community. A list of our uniforms is provided further on in this newsletter. There are also second-hand uniforms available at the office.

Student Attendance and Arrival Times

It is important that your child attends school on a daily basis to ensure the continuity of his/her learning. Time away from school cannot be made up by simply catching up on tasks that are missed. The explicit (specific) teaching skills along with the interactions & discussions with peers / teachers provide students with a rich learning experience that occurs at that set point in time and simply cannot be repeated at the same depth.

If a student is absent from school for any reason, we are required to be notified. Parents / carers are required to do this before 9.30am on the day of the absence. You can do this in the following way:

- Log in to Compass and directly lodge your child's absence
- Phone the school directly after 8:30am of a morning.

Students who arrive at school after 9.05am must be signed into school by the adult dropping them off at the office.

We provide teacher supervision in the morning from 8.30 am. Students arriving prior to this time, cannot be adequately supervised. After school, staff will remain outside until approximately 3.30 pm. If students are still out the front, they will be brought into the office area until their parents come in to collect them. Staff have meetings on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons, starting at 3:30pm, so we would ask that parents be particularly punctual on these days. We are very fortunate to offer before and after-school care each day. I encourage parents to utilise this service instead of dropping their child off at school early. Please contact Their Care directly to register and book your child in.

Communication With Teachers

Seesaw is a great way to keep up to date with not only the happenings around the school, but also what your child is learning in the classroom. Seesaw also has the accessibility to direct message your child's classroom teacher. If you have any questions or queries, please don't hesitate to contact them. Please be mindful that teachers will only reply to your messages between the hours of 8:30am and 4:30pm on weekdays. Teachers will be focussed on teaching your child during the day, and may not get to your message until after school.

Personal Goods Brought To School

Students, staff and visitors often bring personal property to school. This can include mobile phones, toys, expensive stationery or sporting equipment. The Department of Education and Training does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it will generally not pay for any loss or damage to such property. Staff and students are discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or valuable items to school. Toys and sporting equipment from home are also discouraged. If your child is bringing a mobile phone or smart watch/device to school, it MUST be left at the school office. This is a Department requirement.

Our lunch orders from Butler's Pantry will begin on Wednesday 7th of February. Please log on to Munch Monitor, update your child's class and place their order. Instructions can be found further on in the newsletter.

Assembly



Reading At Home

Students should now be bringing home books for reading. We ask that you encourage your child to use the reading satchel to protect our school's reading resources. Reading each night at home should become part of each family's routine. Taking the time to read every night can greatly impact your child's academic performance. The statistics around reading for 20 minutes a night are staggering. For our younger students, these 20 minutes, include being read to by a parent or carer and discussing the story being shared. The reading journal / student diary is a great way to track your home reading progress. We ask that parents and students aim to read for a minimum of 200 nights for the year. In the coming weeks, we will be hosting parent information sessions, including one focusing on reading. This is a wonderful opportunity to find out how you can help your child with their home reading.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
