SICKNESS & COVID

I wanted to bring to your attention that we have had a few reported cases of COVID-19 within our school community. Please rest assured that we are closely monitoring the situation and taking all necessary precautions to ensure the safety and well-being of our students and staff. We kindly ask for your cooperation in following the advice and guidelines provided by the Department. By adhering to these recommendations, we can collectively minimise the spread of the virus and protect all members of our community, especially those who are medically vulnerable. It is recommended that staff members, students and visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of symptomatic students will be asked to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic. The Department of Health recommends that staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 isolate for a minimum of 5 days and do not attend school until their symptoms resolve. ABSENCES

SCHOOL HOURS

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 7:00am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so, but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.
