Principal's Message...

Friday the 19th of August

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week it is a timely reminder that you need to be aware of the content that your children are exposed to when they engage in online social media platforms. We are currently dealing with the fall out of social media issues that are happening outside of school hours. The minimum sign up age for Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Tik Tok, Twitter and YouTube is 13. We would appreciate all parents having a conversation with their child around this and ensure that you are monitoring device usage. Next Term, students in Years 4-6 will be involved in a program called PROJECT ROCKIT, which is endorsed by the eSafety Commissioner. Students will learn tangible skills to maintain digital wellbeing, including how to look out for each other online, take positive action on the issues they care about, and use technology to foster social connection.

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. We encourage all families to participate in this survey. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. While previously a random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents/caregivers/guardians have been selected to participate, this year, all families are invited to participate in the survey. Further information, including password and links, has been mailed to all parents this week. Please keep an eye on your mailbox. The survey is now open and closes on Friday 16th September.

There is lots of talk amongst the staff about dress ups at the moment- Book Week does that to teachers! Please don't forget that our annual Book Week Parade is on next Friday the 26th of August. You are welcome to join us for our parade, which we will be hosting in the BER building from 9:05am. I am throwing out a Book Week challenge to you grown ups- come to our parade dressed up as a character from one of your favourite books and let's see if we can guess who you are!

This week we proudly celebrated National Science Week with an engaging and highly interactive day of science activities on Wednesday. This year's Science Week Theme was "Glass: More than meets the eye". It was truly amazing to see how well our Science Week celebrations were embraced by students and staff this year, in a fun and inspiring way. Our gratitude goes to Mrs Henschke and all staff who worked before and after school hours to set up the fabulous activities.






