ATTENDANCE

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begins with students coming to school each day. We have seen an increase in student absences from Foundation to Year 6 in 2025. There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It is vital that they're only away when they need to be. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future - a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes. Remember, everyday counts, including being at school on time and ready to learn. If you need support with your child's attendance please reach out to your child's classroom teacher or myself.

2026 CLASS PLACMENTS

It is that time of the year when we are looking at our student numbers and possible grade structures for 2026. If you have a child beginning Foundation next year and you are yet to fill out an enrolment form, please contact the office ASAP. Likewise, if you know of any other families who would like to attend our school in 2026, please encourage them to speak to me.

If you know your child is leaving the school at the end of the year, could you please contact the front office as soon as possible so we can factor this into our decision making for next year. Student enrolments have a huge impact on our budget and possible grade structures; therefore, we would like to know that all students are accounted for when making decisions for 2026.

In November, teachers alongside the leadership team, will commence placing students into their 2026 classes. This process consists of a strategic approach to ensuring our classroom structures are balanced and supportive of learning. Staff consider multiple factors when constructing the classes for the upcoming year; gender balance, academic achievement balance, behavioural needs and the overall combination of student personalities. Students have a voice regarding their placement by nominating five (5) learning partners. Teachers will ensure that your child is placed with one of these nominated learning partners.

In addition to this, if parents have any concerns or information they would like to share with us regarding their child, can you please contact me via phone **before Friday the 7th of November**. Changes made to classes after students have been placed is extremely difficult and normally cause a snowball effect of other students also needing to be moved. This is not fair on students, and why **requests will not be accepted after the above date.** Please also note that requests cannot be made for a specific teacher.

REMINDERS

ABSENCES

We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 7:00am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so, but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.
